

Breathtaking: local arts commission wins Eco-Prize



The Eco-Prize has been awarded to a contemporary visual art work created by Matthew Dalziel and Louise Scullion and commissioned by Deveron Arts.

The award celebrates creative, literary or artistic work in Scotland which promotes greener lifestyles was announced recently at an awards ceremony in Glasgow. The winning prize of £1,250 went to ‘Breath Taking’, a work of photographic billboard art by the Dundee-based artists partnership, Matthew Dalziel and Louise Scullion, commissioned and curated by Huntly based Deveron Arts.

The artists have a long-standing relationship with Aberdeenshire, having lived for many years in the coastal village of St. Combs.

Deveron Arts was formed in 1995 by a group of Huntly residents and acts as a catalyst for contemporary arts in the rural community. With the philosophy “the town is the venue” Deveron Arts have invited artists from all over the world to come to the town and work with the community.
