

NOTICES

Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 - Mandatory Section 110 Notice

– as attached, which must be displayed:

at all times

- a) at each place on the premises where sales of alcohol are made, and
- b) in a position where it is readily visible to any person seeking to buy alcohol

This notice is in the prescribed form and of the prescribed dimensions (A4 size or larger) and containing the correct statement word for word.

Should be displayed at the entry to the Alcohol area and displayed next to tills so it can be read by anyone wishing to purchase alcohol.

Other signage to be considered:

Notice – admission of persons under 18 - there is to be displayed so that it is reasonably visible to customers entering the premises a sign of at least A4 size which:

- a) states that persons under the age of 18 are not permitted on the premises; or
- b) states that such persons are permitted on the premises or on such parts of the premises as are specified on the sign

(Could also include terms of entry – accompanied by adult only for example)

Proof of Age – you may wish to enforce a '21 policy' whereby staff check the age of all persons who appear to be under 21. Staff also need to know what proof of age is acceptable and what procedure they must follow when refusing service. Do you have a procedure in place for refusing service? What is the policy for recording refusals?

Pubwatch – some areas operate pubwatch schemes where a group of licensees will work together to warn each other about potential problem customers. Groups meet regularly to discuss any issues and often invite a representative from the police to attend – working in partnership to reduce public nuisance, crime and disorder will ensure that events are run smoothly – making events safer.

Other signage to be considered:

Glass, Bottles, Weapons, Drugs, Noise, First Aid, Fire

Smoking, Health and Social Care (Scotland) Act 2005, Prohibition of Smoking in Certain Premises (Scotland) Regulations 2006

The law prohibits smoking in certain public places which are wholly or substantially enclosed. This is an area with a ceiling or roof that – except for doors, windows and passageways – is either wholly enclosed (whether permanently or temporarily or is enclosed but for an opening which is less than half of the area of its wall. (Marquees are not exempt from this legislation)

To comply display the required No Smoking signs of at least signage of at least 230mm by 160mm in size, in such a way as to make staff, customers and visitors aware that they must comply with the law

LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT 2005

This notice is displayed in accordance with the provisions of section 110 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

It is an offence for a person under the age of 18 to buy or attempt to buy alcohol on these premises.

It is also an offence for any other person to buy or attempt to buy alcohol on these premises for a person under the age of 18.

Where there is doubt as to whether a person attempting to buy alcohol on these premises is aged 18 or over, alcohol will not be sold to the person except on production of evidence showing the person to be 18 or over.
