## NOTES

1. The Deregulation (Gaming Machines and Betting Office Facilities) Order 1996 came into force on 20th June 1996. Before that date "Fruit Machines" covered by Gaming Machine Permits, also known as Amusement with Prizes Machines (AWPs), could only have a maximum cash prize of £4.00. Beyond this, up to a maximum of £8.00, the payout had to be in tokens or non cash prizes. The maximum stake was 25p.

The 1996 Order retained the existing AWP machine with the above limits but also introduced a new type of machine known as an All Cash Machine. The maximum cash prize has been set at £10.00 for these machines. The maximum stake is still 25p.

Please indicate how many of each type of machine you have and indicate where they are located.

2. "All Cash Machines" have to be located in a "bar" area. Failure to observe this condition is a criminal offence. A "bar" is defined as an area as "any place exclusively or mainly used for the sale and consumption of alcohol". The presence of a bar counter would be indicative that an area was a "bar". Children under 14 are not permitted in bar areas (unless a Children's Certificate is in force) and accordingly they could not generally have access to "All Cash Machines".
3. This application form is not appropriate if the machines(s) is/are the larger payout "Jackpot" machines(s). Clubs have to apply to the Sheriff Court to use such machines. Other persons would have to apply to the Council for separate permission (e.g. bingo clubs, casinos, amusement arcades etc.) Applicants should obtain their own legal advice on the operation of such machines.
