- You will not be charged by the Council for paying by this method. Any bank or building society charges should be less than for a cheque payment or Standing Order.
- Your arrangement is renewed automatically each year.

- You are still in complete control although we do all the work for you.
- You will still receive your rent statements and rent increase letters although these will be for information only.
- You will have to change your arrangement if you move to a different local authority.

Direct Debit is the easiest, most convenient way to pay and the guarantee ensures full security for you

The Direct Debit Guarantee

This Guarantee is offered by all banks and building societies that accept instructions to pay Direct Debits.

- If there are any changes to the amount, date or frequency of your Direct Debit Aberdeenshire Council will notify you 10 working days in advance of your account being debited or as otherwise agreed. If you request Aberdeenshire Council to collect a payment, confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request.
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit by Aberdeenshire Council or your bank or building society you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society.
- If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when Aberdeenshire Council asks you to.
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required. Please also notify us.
