



- 1** Hercules Linton the designer of the famous tea clipper the 'Cutty Sark' was born in Inverberrie.
- 2** Inverberrie was both a fishing port and later an industrial centre for the spinning of linen yarn from flax grown in the hinterland.
- 3** The path follows the Inverberrie to Montrose railway line. The line was 13 miles long and had a frequent service carrying both passengers and goods. The line closed in 1966.
- 4** The fishing moved to Gourdon from Inverberrie to make use of the superior harbour designed by Thomas Telford.
