



1 Hill of Doune – This viewpoint offers panoramic views over Banff and Macduff, along the coast and up the Deveron Valley. The landmark Temple of Venus, part of the planned landscape setting for Duff House, rewards the short climb.

2 Macduff – Created a burgh by the 2nd Earl of Fife (family name Duff) developed into a prosperous boat building and fishing town dominated by the Italianate Doune Church (1806). The seatown has largely disappeared due to harbour related expansion including 2 Harbour Head former home of the Marine Artist and Author Peter Anson. Don't miss the Aquarium which has all the marine species found in the Moray Firth on display.

3 The mineral well at Tarlair was popular to the country folk in the 19th Century and many travelled considerable distances to 'take the waters'. The well ceased to flow following a sea mine explosion in the Second War.

4 The art deco Tarlair pool, established in the 1930s, was a great attraction to visitors and locals up to the 1950s. This open air swimming pool is now used as a model boat pond.
