- 1** Whitehills dates from the 18th century and still retains the character of a fishing village although the harbour is now a marina. The landmark Trinity Church of Scotland was relocated stone by stone from Banff in 1925.
- 2** Blackpotts Harbour – this tiny hog backed pier served the Blackpotts brick and tile works, now the caravan park. Clay was quarried from the Knock and transformed into the distinctive red drainage ‘tiles’, shards of which can be found on the seashore.
- 3** The ancient Royal Burgh of Banff dates from before 1163 when Malcolm IV occupied the royal castle. It prospered by trading with the Baltic States, reaching its peak prosperity in the 18th century evidenced by the many fine Georgian buildings. High point is Duff House William Adam (1735-49) which has gone from grand home to hotel then prisoner of war camp and is now an outstation of the National Gallery of Scotland. Follow the Town Trail and appreciate the best of Banff.
