



1 On Sandend beach you can see the anti tank blocks - a reminder of the 2nd war. Look carefully and you can spot the pill boxes at either end of the beach and at low tide you can spot the anti glider posts.

2 Behind Glassaugh distillery (not in use) you can spot the 'cup and saucer' - the remains of a large windmill on the former Glassaugh Estate.

3 At Redhyth you can see the remains of the rifle range where the local volunteers practiced their skills from the 19th century onwards.

4 Portsoy, created a burgh in 1550, was an important trading port before turnpike roads and the railways made travel easier. Portsoy marble (Serpentine) was exported and used most famously in the Palace of Versailles. The streets have many interesting 17th and 18th century buildings in the Scottish vernacular style. Home of the Traditional Small Boats festival in early July.
