# Killer Barbecues!



...in the countryside

...and how to  
tame them!

## Raise your barbecue tray above any vegetation

1

Bring two bricks from home and place underneath disposable trays. Never take stones from dry-stone walls for this purpose.



## Extinguish your barbecue fully

Barbecue charcoal can smoulder for hours after lighting. Even remaining ash can start fires in the countryside.



## Take your food scraps home

Food scraps are an unnatural diet for wildlife. They can encourage scavenging animals which then prey on rarer nesting birds.



## Use facilities where provided

Many picnic sites have permanent barbecue stands or pits. These are ideal for burning charcoal or supporting barbecue trays.
