I will now declare the result of the election in the Ward 11 - Inverurie and District. There are 4 Councillors to be elected.
The electorate was 12,128 and the number of ballot papers received was 5,052 giving a percentage turnout of $41.7 \%$. There were 83 rejected ballot papers. The quota of votes for a candidate to be elected was 994 .
